News from the Principal, Dr Lesley Tunnah



As Term 3 winds down, I reflect upon the many events and projects organised and delivered by the faithful staff of the College. Their high standards of creativity, hard work and dedication result in our students receiving a broad education not just of knowledge but of life skills, values and character development underpinned by the College's focus on Christian values.

This term we farewell Mrs Laura Kilborn from the Secondary College. We thank her very much for her service and care of students and pray all the best for her future adventures. New staff have been engaged for Term 4 and we will welcome them officially in Week 1. We thank God for his faithful provision in all arenas of the College.

The buildings on both King's Park and Providence campuses are steadily receiving a facelift with fresh coats of paint, carpet cleaning and renovations where necessary. The goal is to maintain the College facilities to a high standard. This includes the gardens, which were reshaped in recent weeks and are now beginning to produce new buds and greenery. We thank the College's maintenance team for their consistent hard work with these projects.

Professional development opportunities for our teachers also remain a high priority. News from the Board Chair,

Our school year is closing fast with our Year 12 students finishing their secondary education in just two months. It's a rite of passage and we pray that this remaining time will be profitable in completing exams and finishing well.

Our Executive Team, Dr Tunnah, Ms Wright, Mrs Brownsey, Mr Graham, Mr Hobbs and Mrs Buttle, are leading our school with excellence and I thank them for that on behalf of the MCC community.

On a serious note, I want to share with you a matter of concern for Christians and our school. Last Wednesday night, in the concluding week of sittings before the elections on 26th October, the state government passed legislation which will restrict the right to free speech and place restrictions on the Bible as the basis of truth. I include a quote by Rob Norman from the Australian Christian Lobby as follows:

"Queensland Labor has pulled a death blanket over Freedom of Speech and Freedom of Expression of Religion with the late-night passage of the 'The Respect at Work and Other Matters Amendment Bill'.

The unelected bureaucrats of the Queensland Human Rights Commission will now have powers to deem any speech that 'offends, humiliates, or intimidates' any of a growing list of persons with 'protected attributes' as 'harassment' or 'hate speech."

Effectively this puts severe restrictions on what can be said in the classroom or pulpit. While it covers only certain areas of speech at this stage, it may lead to further restrictive legislation and erosion of freedoms.

I do not want to be seen to espouse politics in this letter, but I ask you to pray as you consider your vote at the state elections in October. Nigel Dalton, who has a long history of involvement with MCC, is the LNP candidate for Mackay. There will be a meet and greet on Sunday 22nd in the Powerhouse foyer at 3pm.

Nigel is a committed Christian and attends the Northern Beaches Baptist Church. He was commissioned as the MCC 'Adopt a Cop' in August 2005 and was a sergeant in the Queensland Police Force until his recent retirement. This is a person of honour and commitment who I believe would serve well in the state parliament. His two children did their schooling at MCC. Nigel has also spent many years accompanying Brad Huddleston presentations in schools across Australia, teaching students of the dangers of social media and addiction to digital devices. I encourage your prayer for the election that God might install the government that He wants and we need.

The Federal Government is planning to set an age limit on access to social media and this will be a positive step if properly implemented. I believe we will see improvements in the classroom and in the home as a result.



News from the Head of Academics

2025 Class lists for elective subjects for Year 7, Year 8, Year 10 and Year 11 are being worked through based on the online web preferences received. It appears that most students will be able to study their top preferences. If a student is not able to be placed in one of the subjects corresponding to their top preferences, their next preference will be used.

A few subjects will not be offered in 2025 due to the low level of interest from students. These are:

- Year 8 Media Arts
- Year 11 Study of Religion
- Year 11 ICT

It should be noted that for a school of our size, we offer a wide range of elective subjects that provide learning pathways that assist our students achieve their career goals.

At the end of week 3 next term, Year 10 students will finish the Year 10 Australian Curriculum. At the beginning of week 4, they will be issued with a new timetable and will begin to study their Year 11 Unit 1 subjects. Year 11 students will begin their Year 12 Unit 3 at this time. Subject changes for Year 10 and 11 students should be finalised early next term.

QCAA has started to release the Confirmation decisions for the final internal assessment for the Year 12 General subjects. Teachers will communicate to students the results of these decisions as they are released. The final reports for Year 12 students will be published early next term. The progressive ratings will be reported on the normal A-E scale. Additionally for general subjects, the reports will include a mark out of 50 or 75 which is the final internal assessment rating.

For Year 11 and 12 students who are undertaking General subjects, this coming term break should not be viewed as a holiday! To achieve a maximum level of success, students should be engaged in a regular study and revision program over the break. Year 11 block exams will begin in week 1 of Term 4 and will continue over the first three weeks. Year 12 students will continue to do mock exams over the first two weeks and then start External Exams in week 4. An exam schedule for Year 11 and 12 students will be published over the next week. Students are expected to be at school during the mock exam period and Year 11 block exam period. Once the Year 12 external exams begin, all Year 12 classes will cease and students only need to be at school for their scheduled external exam blocks.

I wish all our students a well-deserved time of rest over the holidays and much success in their learning journey in Term 4. My prayer is that they will develop and flourish in all areas of their life and will grow a deeper understanding of God's love for them and His plans and purposes for their lives.


