In the first week back of next term, Mr Warren Tysoe and TTC team are adventuring off to Brisbane with the Year 12 Formula High School students to see their car building skills on the racetrack. Seeing the fruits of their practical skills is a driving force for motivation – both now and in the future. It was also wonderful to see the MCC Robotics Team, headed by Miss Karina Perkins, place first in a 'Dance' challenge earlier this term. The robotics students proved innovative in creating dance skills via technology. At the same time, the TTC Team were also placing in various segments of the F1 in Schools Competition. It's a fine art considering physics, mathematics, technology, design, skill, marketing, networking and of course fun!

I want to thank our families for journeying alongside us.



News from the Head of Academics

2026 Class lists for elective subjects for Year 8 2026, Year 10 2026 and Year 11 2026 are being worked through based on the online web preferences. Most students will be able to study the elective subjects based on their top preferences. Year 8 STEM will not be offered in 2026 due to the low level of interest from students.



We will publish the Year 7-9 Mid Semester 2 Reports during the next week. The achievement rating that is reported reflects student progressive achievement in each subject over Terms 1-3. The exception to this is the Year 7 elective subjects as they only started in Semester 2.

For a school our size, we offer a wide range of elective subjects that provide a learning pathway for our students that will support them to achieve their career goals. Teaching staff enjoyed the opportunity to meet with Year 10 students and parents for Choice Chat meetings in week 7. As a cohort, our Year 10 students have high aspirations for their senior studies, and this is great to see.

At the end of Term 4, week 3, Year 10 students will finish the Year 10 Australian Curriculum for their subjects. At the beginning of week 4, they will be issued with a new timetable and will begin to study their Unit 1 subjects. Year 11 students will begin Unit 3 at this time. Subjects changes for Year 10 and 11 students should be finalised early next term.

QCAA has started to release the Confirmation decisions for the final internal assessment for the Year 12 General subjects. Teachers will communicate to students the results of these decisions as

they are released. The final reports for Yr 12 students will be published early next term. The progressive ratings will be reported on the normal A-E scale. Additionally for general subjects the reports will include a mark out of 50 or 75 which is the final Senior internal assessment rating.

For Years 11 and 12, students who are undertaking General subjects, this coming holiday will not be a normal holiday. To achieve a higher level of success, students should be engaged in a regular study and revision program over the holidays. Year 11 exams will begin in week 1 next term and will continue over the first three weeks. Year 12 students will continue to do mock exams over the first two weeks and then start External Exams in week 4. An exam schedule for Years 11 and 12 students has been sent this week to students and parents. Students are expected to be at school during the mock exam period and Year 11 exam period. Once the Year 12 external exams begin, all Year 12 classes will cease. and students only need to be at school for their scheduled external exams.

I wish all our students a well-deserved time of rest over the holidays and much success in their learning journey this semester. My prayer is that they will develop and flourish in all areas of their life and will grow a deeper understanding of God's love for them and His plans and purposes for their lives.

I'll finish with a quote from Max Lucado from his book, "Cure for the Common Life". It is an encouragement to us all.

"Use your uniqueness to make a big deal out of God, everyday of your life".

- Privacy breaches are widespread: Incidents include hacking, doxxing (publishing private info), and the sharing of personal details without consent.
- Inappropriate content is a growing concern: Students are increasingly exposed to violent, sexual, or otherwise harmful material online—often without warning.

Care for your computer

Everything you post online leaves a trace. Be kind, respectful, and thoughtful. Your digital footprint should reflect the best version of you.

Enjoy the e-adventure with excellence

Explore the digital world with curiosity and creativity. Use technology to learn, create, and connect—always striving for excellence in everything you do.

Always avoid danger

Think before you click. Don't share personal information, and be cautious when chatting online. If something feels wrong, speak up.

Reliable resources rule

Not all websites—or tools—are created equal. Use trusted sources for research, learning, and fun. And remember: AI generated content can sometimes be inaccurate or misleading, so always verify with reliable sources.

These values help students make smart choices online—but they're most effective when supported by a strong partnership between school and home. I would encourage you to take the time to talk regularly with your child about their online experiences. Setting up Tech Free Zones (eg bedrooms) can help promote lifestyle balance and reduce distractions. Always encourage responsible digital behaviour and reporting of any online issues.
