

# HUMANITIES

Year 10 Humanities develops students' ability to think critically and creatively about the world around them while fostering curiosity, inquiry and informed decision-making. Aligned with the Australian Curriculum v9.0, students investigate historical, geographical, economic, business and civic issues that shape contemporary societies and influence the future.

Students study History and one additional Humanities subject from Geography, Business and Economics, or Civics and Citizenship. Courses are delivered through two semester rotations, providing students with opportunities to explore different disciplines and develop a broad understanding of human societies, environments and systems.

Through inquiry-based learning, students analyse evidence, evaluate perspectives, investigate real-world issues and communicate informed conclusions. These experiences help students develop the knowledge, skills and understanding required to be active and responsible citizens in an increasingly interconnected world.

Year 10 Humanities provides valuable preparation for senior Humanities subjects, including Study of Religion, Modern History, Geography and Business by introducing students to the expectations, skills and ways of thinking required for success in Years 11 and 12.

At Mackay Christian College, Humanities is taught through a Christian worldview that encourages students to understand God's world, value the dignity of all people, and consider how they can contribute positively to society. The subject reflects the College's CLEAR values by developing Christlikeness through service and compassion, Learning through inquiry and investigation, Excellence in critical thinking and communication, Attitude through curiosity and perseverance, and Respect for diverse cultures, perspectives and experiences.
