Year 10 Camp – Seaforth Pines Outdoor Education Centre

Dear Parents/Carers

The Year 10 cohort will be participating in our annual camping program. It is a vital tool in building relationships between our students and provides staff with a unique opportunity to minister into their lives in a non-school setting.

The theme of the camp is 'Confident for Service'. Year 10 Camp is an integral part of your child's education, including:

- 1) Learning Beyond the Classroom: Nothing compares to the hands-on learning experience that camp offers. Every activity is an opportunity for your child to engage with the world and with each other in a meaningful way.
- 2) Building Connections: Camp fosters a sense of bonding and teamwork like no other experience. Your child will have the chance to forge lasting friendships with peers and build connections with supportive staff members who are there to guide and inspire them.
- 3) Personal Growth: Adolescence is a time of immense growth and self-discovery; Year 10 Camp provides the environment for your child to explore their interests, talents and aspirations. Opportunities will present themselves for each student to conquer new challenges and experiences, and build on personal development.
- 4) Preparing for the Future: As your child transitions into young adulthood, Year 10 Camp offers valuable insights and guidance for the journey ahead. Through meaningful conversations with staff members and exposure to new experiences, the aim is for your child to gain a clearer understanding of their path forward.

All equipment must be clearly labelled with student's full name

The following items cannot be taken on camp:

- Mobile phones
- Any electronic equipment
- Clothing that does not reflect the CLEAR Values of the College
- Any other items not normally allowed at the College, including but not limited to jewellery

No responsibility will be taken for personal devices, including but not limited to mobile phones, earphones and jewellery. These items will be confiscated and returned at the end of camp.

Parents/carers will be notified if a student is found not complying with the College Code of Conduct or the instructions of College staff, or staff at each of the activities. The student may be sent home as a result and any additional expense incurred will be the responsibility of the parent/carer.

There will be no swimming allowed for any part of camp but activities on the beach will occur.

If your child requires medication at camp, the attached '*Request for Medication at Camp*' form must be completed, signed and returned to Secondary Reception, along with the pharmacy labelled medication for prescription medication and/or over the counter medication such as Panadol or Nurofen, in a Ziplock bag. Students cannot keep medication in their belongings (except for asthma puffers and/or epi-pens). All medication will be held and distributed by the designated First Aid Officer.

The two attached Waiver forms must be completed, signed and returned by either email to mbarrett@mccmky.qld.edu.au, or printed and handed to Secondary Reception, **no later than Wednesday, 14 May 2025.**

Please respond to this invitation for your child to attend the Year 10 Camp through Parent Lounge **by Wednesday, 14 May 2025**. No payment is required.


